## FGS 2011 Conference: Pathways to the Heartland

or its 35th year, the Federation of Genealogical Societies Annual Conference returns to the Prairie State in 2011—twenty years since its 1981 event in Decatur, Illinois. Springfield—the state capital and the historical home of Abraham Lincoln-will play host to thousands of genealogists and genealogical society members for Pathways to the Heartland, September 7–10, 2011.

If you have attended a previous FGS Conference, you know the excitement of not only learning from many of the top genealogy speakers in the country but also networking and socializing with fellow family historians in a congenial setting.

### Illinois State Genealogical Society

The local host for FGS 2011 is the Illinois State Genealogical Society (ISGS), founded in 1968 in Springfield. Local Conference Chairs and ISGS board members Susie Pope and David Kent Coy will be assisting FGS board members Pat Oxley, D. Joshua Taylor and others with providing a unique and exceptional educational experience for every genealogist.

### Historic Springfield

Established in 1819, Springfield became the state capital in 1837 with the help of a young lawyer and politician named Abraham Lincoln. The sixth largest city in Illinois, it is also the county seat for Sangamon County and is conveniently located at the intersections of Interstates 55 and 72.

While our ancestors may have come to or through Illinois by covered wagon or on foot, other more up-to-date modes of transportation are available to get to the Prairie State:

- Plane: Springfield is easily accessible by air via the Abraham Lincoln Capital Airport as well as the Lambert-St. Louis Airport which is only 100 miles away.
- Train: Amtrak has daily trains from both Chicago and St. Louis, Missouri, which serve Springfield. The train station is just five blocks from the host hotel and convention center.
  - Car: For those traveling by car, Chicago lies 200 miles northeast of Springfield. St. Louis

and Indianapolis lie 100 miles southwest and 195 miles due east, respectively. And don't forget—historic Route 66 goes right through Springfield!

### Conference

At FGS 2011, *Pathways to the Heartland*, four great days of genealogy and family history will take place beginning Wednesday, September 7 through Saturday, September 10, 2011. During this time you'll be able to attend educational presentations, network with other genealogists, stock up on genealogy books and supplies in the exhibit hall, share a meal with new friends, attend special events and perhaps even get some sleep!

### Venue

Downtown Springfield will serve as the base of all FGS 2011 activities. This city with its small-town character is filled with restaurants, shops and historic sites. From the conference venue it is just a quick walk to the Illinois State Archives as well as the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum.
